### **Project Proposal**

### **Martha Dendy Community Center**

**1(a).** The primary purpose of the Martha Dendy Community is to provide effective and quality services to the underprivileged section of society to equip themselves with knowledge and skills, to improve their life-content by providing exceptional services to ensure they all have an equal opportunity to live, learn, play, and work and thus serve their community within itself.

The Martha Dendy Community Center will play a critical role in the development of people's social, emotional, and academic skills with after school professional working daily to meet the individual needs of each person.

The after-school tutoring program is to assist children who have failing grades, who are having difficulty maintaining passing grades or students who wants to improve their grades.

We can improve the overall student performance of our students with the entire community working together to assist students with improving their grades while also improving their chance for a better quality of life. The Martha Dendy Community Center will partner with the local school districts in Laurens County, South Carolina to identify students who could benefit from our services. Volunteers, including current and retired teachers, local college students and the staff of the Martha Dendy Community Center will perform these services throughout the school year. All personnel working within the program will have background investigations performed at the cost of MDCC to ensure the welfare of the children, community, and program.

Summer recreational activities will include inside and outside activities such as basketball, volleyball, and soccer. Our goal is to address the needs of at-risk youth to keep them out of harm's way while simultaneously strengthening local communities through an integrated range of services and recreational activities provided in an educational environment, and tailored to community needs, enhancing the overall quality of life for those individuals who will be served. As a nonprofit organization, it allows us to assist those individuals who otherwise could not participate in other recreational programs due to a lack of income.

- 1(b). Code Section 4-10-330(A)(1) of the South Carolina Code of Laws which the project qualifies for CPST funding:
- (b) courthouses, administration buildings, civic centers, hospitals, emergency medical facilities, police stations, fire stations, jails, correctional facilities, detention facilities, libraries, coliseums, educational facilities under the direction of an area commission for technical education, or any combination of these projects.
- (c) cultural, recreational, or historic facilities, or any combination of these facilities.
- 2(a) See attached tax maps of property involved.
- 2(b) The City of Clinton currently owns the former Martha Dendy School property. The city has agreed to transfer ownership to the Martha Dendy Community Center contingent upon community center receiving its 501(c)(3) tax exempt status. The application was filed with the Internal Revenue Service in February, 2020.
- 2(c) Attached is a map which shows all assess points to be used by the public.
- 2(d) Water, sanitary sewer, electricity, will storm sewer will be needed to serve the project which is currently available on the property. The City of Clinton will connect the services for a fee of \$75.00.
- 2(e)Due to prior use of the building as a public school, no clearing, grading or drainage is needed. A temporary permit will be obtained for \$100.00 to be used during renovations.
- 2(f) The City of Clinton has completed a Phase One Environmental Site Assessment of the property.
- 2(g) There are no current zoning restrictions. (See attached letter).
- 2(h) We estimate that 50 people and 20 vehicles will be on or in the general vicinity of property at times of peak usage.
- 2(i)The building occupies approximately 15% of the acreage. There is available property for any future expansion.

- 3(a) The building being renovated is the former Martha Dendy School into a community center to provide tutoring and recreational activities to underpriviledged children. The total estimate for renovations, \$700,000.00.
- 3(b) The estimate cost for engineering/design, \$35,000.00.
- 3(c) Cost estimates for exterior lighting, security systems, utility connections, landscaping and other similar services, \$20,000.00.
- 3(d) Cost estimates for furnishings, computers, equipment, appliances, etc., \$36000.00.
- 3(e) The design work for the project has been completed. Construction will commence once the property is transferred, funding is obtained and a contractor is secured.

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
Laurens County Property Parcel
