GIVE A BRIEF STATEMENT OF NEED FOR AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FUNDS.

American Legion Post 25 is a public service organization focusing on supporting veterans and developing leadership skills in the youth of our community as an investment in the future of Laurens County, South Carolina, and the United States. We are a non profit (501(c)(19) Military organization. We have no paid employees and all of our administrative and service operations are provided on a volunteer basis.

During the last three years we have been engaged in fundraising efforts for our community service charity projects and for our building fund. During the COVID 19 pandemic, our ability to interact with the public and to raise funds has been severely restricted and in some cases curtailed.

While we have been able to meet most of our community charity commitments, we are way behind on our building fund goals. Why do we need a building fund? Simply, because we believe that having a permanent base of operations will allow us to provide a broader scope of support to the veterans and youth of our community.

An ARPA Grant will put our building fund back on track towards establishing an American Legion Post 25 base of operations which will in turn be maintained in the service of community veterans and youth.

Although we are requesting \$250,000, we will be grateful for any increase to that amount that the County may see fit to grant. Our demonstrated track record of community service clearly shows that funds invested in Post 25 are turned around to the direct benefit to the citizens of Laurens County.


The American Legion was chartered by the US Congress in 1919 at the close of WWI for the express purpose of providing support and a voice to US Veterans. The Legion represents all veterans with no recognition of rank or military position. The Legion has been directly involved with Congress to pass legislation leading to the Veterans Administration, the GI Bill and more recently the recognition of combat related medical issues such as Agent Orange from the Vietnam era.

The Legion is organized by National, State, District, and Local organizations. Our local organization in Laurens is Post 25, which was also chartered in 1919.

It is the self-stated mission of Post 25 to be "A Force for Good in the Community," with the mantra, "Whatever it takes to make Laurens a better place."

Post 25 raises funds in the community for the support of Veterans and Children, as well as Laurens County citizens in need. Local community projects include support for District 55 Middle schools and Laurens High School with the Legion Citizenship Awards, Boys State, Girls State, the Nathan Wolfe Law Enforcement Academy, and the National Constitutional Oratory Contest

It is our goal to build a Post home for Post 25 which will be used as a base of operations for our activities and in support of Veterans, children's, and community programs.



2. Describe in detail how the pandemic has affected your organization.

The Post 25 building started program started in 2019 just before the beginning of the COVID 19 pandemic.

The ongoing effects and ramifications of PTSD in veterans is well documented. While many of those who served return home and assimilate back into society, sadly, many do not. To quote a phase from a letter written by a veteran who returned recently to the Laurens County community, "For the last year, I have walked through places that most people cannot even imagine. Now I am home, and trying to assimilate back into a society that neither understands me, nor wants me." It is for men and women such as this that the American Legion was formed. A Post Home, gives both recent veterans, as well as older veterans, a place to associate with other men and women "who get it," who understand their journey back to normalcy and help each other. Post 25 has been working hard to raise funds to create a Post Home, but for the past two years, we have been significantly hindered in our ability to initiate and sustain any meaningful building fund projects. This grant will put us well on our way to achieving the creation of a place for veterans, as well as a place of outreach by veterans to the community.

3. How will any funding awarded be utilized?

All funding awarded will be used directly and exclusively to build an American Legion, Post 25 assembly and activity hall which will be in compliance with all existing codes normally applicable to a public building. The building envisioned will be approximately 90 X 200 feet.

We see this building being a center of activity, not only for veterans, but for community events as well. Post 25 espouses to be "A Force for Good in the Community." We also have a saying that goes, "Whatever it takes to make this a better place." Veterans are mission minded. No one in the Post is paid, or makes money from Post 25 activities. On the contrary, we are all volunteers with the mission focus of making Laurens County, and the City of Laurens, a better place.

Our ability to move forward with this project is predicated on both our success in raising money for our building fund and the acquisition of land from Laurens County, preferably the tractadjacent to the new VA Support Center and Bolangles.



Constitution of American Legion Lake Garrett Post 25 Department of South Carolina

Preamble

For God and Country, we associate ourselves together for the following purposes: To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America; to maintain law and order; to foster and perpetuate a one hundred percent Americanism; to preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in the Great Wars; to inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation; to combat the autocracy of both the classes and the masses; to make right the master of might; to promote peace and good will on earth; to safeguard and transmit to Posterity the principles of justice, freedom and democracy; to consecrate and sanctify our comradeship by our devotion to mutual helpfulness.

Article I-- Name

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be Lake Garrett Post 25, The American Legion, Department of SC.

Article II-Objects

Section 1. The objects and purposes of this Post shall be to promote the principles and policies as set forth in the foregoing preamble, and the national and Departmental Constitutions of The American Legion.

Article III-- Nature

- Section 1. This Post is a civilian organization and membership therein does not affect or increase liability for military or police service.
- Sec. 2. This organization shall be absolutely nonpolitical and shall not be used for the dissemination of partisan principles nor for the promotion of the candidacy of any person seeking public office or preferment.
- Sec. 3. Rank does not exist in The American Legion; no member shall be addressed by his military or naval title in any meeting of this Post.

Article IV -- Membership

- Section 1. Eligibility to membership in this Post shall be as prescribed by the National Constitution of The American Legion.
- Sec. 2. Application for membership shall be made in writing under such regulations as may from time to time be prescribed by the Post Executive Committee.
- Sec. 3. All applications for membership shall be acted upon at the next Post meeting following the making of such application, and shall at such meeting, be accepted, rejected or referred for further investigation and consideration. If a majority of the members cast their vote against the acceptance of said application, then such application shall be recorded as rejected.
- Sec. 4. Any member of this Post may be expelled for cause by a two-thirds vote of the Executive Committee after charges are preferred under oath in writing, and a fair trial had upon the same.*

- Sec. 5. A member who has been expelled or suspended from this Post for any cause may be reinstated to membership by a two-thirds vote of the membership present in Post meeting, and the payment of current dues for the year in which the reinstatement occurs.
- Sec. 6. No person who, has been expelled by a Post shall be admitted to membership in this Post, without the consent of the expelling Post, except that where such consent has been asked for and denied by such Post, may then appeal to the state Executive Committee of the Department of the expelling Post for permission to apply for membership in this Post, and shall be ineligible for membership until such permission is granted.

*Before proceeding under this section, Posts should make inquiry as to whether or not the Department Constitution and By-Laws, has provided a different procedure which should be followed.

Article V-- Officers

- Section 1. The administrative affairs of this Post of The American Legion shall, except as may be otherwise provided by the By-Laws, be under the supervision of an Executive Committee which shall consist of 5 members in addition to the officers of the Post. The term of office of members of the Executive Committee shall be for one year. This Post, by its By-Laws, may provide for such other standing committees as the business of the organization may require.
- Sec. 2. The officers of this Post shall be a commander, a vice-commander, an adjutant, a finance officer, a Post chaplain, a Post service officer, and such other officers as may be deemed necessary by this organization, who shall be nominated from the floor at the meeting preceding the annual election.
- Sec. 3. All officers and executive committeemen shall be elected annually, and they shall hold office until their successors are duly installed or as otherwise provided. Any officer or executive committeeman may be removed for inefficiency by the Executive Committee, a two-thirds vote of said committee being necessary to effect such removal.
 - Sec. 4. Every member of this Post in good standing shall be eligible to hold office in this Post.
- Sec. 5. The duties of officers and the executive committee shall be those usually appertaining to such officers or committee and as further provided in the By-Laws.

Article VI—Finance

- Section 1. The revenue of this Post shall be derived from membership or initiation fees, from annual membership dues and from such other sources as may be approved by the Post Executive Committee.
- Sec. 2. The amount of such membership or initiation fees and the amount of such annual Post dues shall be fixed and determined by this Post.
- Sec. 3. The Post shall pay to Departmental headquarters the National and Departmental annual membership dues for every member of the Post.

Article VII—American Legion Auxiliary

- Section 1. This Post recognizes an auxiliary organization to be known as the Auxiliary Unit of Lake Garret, Post 25, The American Legion.
- Sec. 2. Membership in the Auxiliary shall be as prescribed by the National Constitution of the American Legion Auxiliary.

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Article VIII-Amendments

Section 1. This Constitution is adopted subject to the provisions of the national Constitution of The American Legion and of the Department Constitution of the Department of SC, The American Legion. Any amendment to said National Constitution or Department Constitution which is in conflict with any provisions hereof shall be regarded as automatically repealing or modifying the provisions of this Constitution to the extent of such conflict.

Sec. 2. This Constitution may be amended at any regular Post meeting by vote of two-thirds of the members of said Post attending such regular meeting, providing the proposed amendment shall have been submitted in writing and read at the next preceding regular meeting of said Post, and providing, further, written notice shall have been given to all members at least 30 days in advance of the date when such amendment is to be voted upon, notifying said members that at such meeting a proposal to amend the Constitution is to be voted upon.

Lake Garrett Post 25 By-Laws

Article 1

- Section 1. The Post existing under these By-Laws is to be known as Lake Garrett Post 25, The American Legion, Department of SC.
 - Sec. 2. The objects of this Post are as set forth in the Constitution.

Article II—Management

- Section 1. The government and management of the Post is entrusted to an Executive Committee of 3 members, to be known as the "Executive Committee."
- Sec. 2. The Executive Committee shall consist of 3 members in addition to the officers of the Post and together with the other officers of this Post shall be elected annually in June and take office at the meeting next following that of the election. All elections of officers and executive committeemen shall be by ballot and the candidate or candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected to the respective office or offices for which they are candidates.
- Sec. 3. All vacancies existing in the Executive Committee, or in any office of the Post from any cause other than the expiration of the term, shall be filled by a majority vote of the remaining members of the committee, and a person so appointed shall hold office for the unexpired term of the member of the committee or officer who succeeded. A vacancy shall exist when a member or officer is absent from the Post for a continuous period considered detrimental to the interest of the Post by the Executive Committee.

Article III—Post Executive Committee

- Section 1. The Post Executive Committee shall meet for organization and such other business as may come before it at the call of the Post commander within 10 days after the installation of the new officers, Thereafter the Post Executive Committee shall meet at the call of the commander at least every month and as often as said commander may deem necessary. The commander shall call a meeting of the Post Executive Committee upon the joint written request of three or more members of said Post Executive Committee, 3 members of the committee shall constitute a quorum thereof.
- Sec. 2. The Post Executive Committee shall hire such employees as may be necessary; shall authorize and approve all expenditures; shall require adequate bonds from all persons having the custody of Post funds; shall hear the reports of Post committee chairs; and generally, shall have charge of and be responsible for the management of the affairs of this Post.

Article IV—Duties of Officers

Section 1. Duties of Post commander. It shall be the duty of the Post commander to preside at all meetings of the Post and to have general supervision over the business and affairs of the Post, and such officer shall be the chief executive officer of the Post. The Commander shall approve all orders directing the disbursement of funds and shall make an annual report covering the business of the Post for the year, and recommendations for the ensuing year, which shall be read at the annual meeting and a

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copy thereof immediately forwarded to the Department adjutant. The Commander shall perform such other duties as directed by the Post.

- Sec. 2. Duties of vice-commander. The vice-commander shall assume and discharge the duties of the office of commander in the absence or disability of, or when called upon by the Post commander.
- Sec. 3. *Duties of Post adjutant*. The adjutant shall have charge of and keep a full and correct record of all proceedings of all meetings, keep such records as the Department and National Organizations may require, render reports of membership annually or when called upon at a meeting, and under direction of the commander handle all correspondence of the Post.
- Sec. 4. Duties of the finance officer. The finance officer of the Post shall have charge of all finances and see that they are safely deposited in some local bank or banks and shall report once a month to the Executive Committee the condition of the finances of the Post, with such recommendations as may deem expedient or necessary for raising funds with which to carry on the activities of the Post. The Finance Officer shall sign all checks disbursing the monies of the Post, and shall furnish such surety bonds in such sum as shall be fixed by the Post Executive Committee.
- Sec. 5. Duties of Post chaplain. The Post chaplain shall be charged with the spiritual welfare of the Post comrades and will offer divine but nonsectarian service in the event of dedications, funerals, public functions, etc., adhere to such ceremonial rituals as are recommended by the national or Department headquarters from time to time.

Article V—Delegates

Section 1. Delegates and alternates to a Department convention shall be elected by ballot by the Post at a regular meeting of the Post to be held at least 20 days prior to the date of such convention.

Article VI-Resolutions

Section 1. All resolutions of state or national scope presented to this Post by a member or reported to this Post by a committee shall merely embody the opinion of this Post on the subject and copy of same shall be forwarded to the Department headquarters for its approval before any publicity is given or action other than mere passage by the Post is taken.

Article VII—Meetings

- Section 1. The regular meeting of the Post shall be held at the current location on the 4th Tuesday of the month, at which may be transacted such business as may properly be brought up for action; such meetings may be converted into entertainment meetings, as may be deemed advisable by the officers of the Post.
- Sec. 2. The Post commander or a majority of the Executive Committee shall have power to call a special meeting of the Post at any time.
- Sec. 3. Upon the written request of majority members, the committee shall call a special meeting of the Post.
 - Sec. 4. ½ of members present + 1 member, shall constitute a quorum.

Article VIII—Notices

Section 1. Every member shall furnish the Post adjutant with an address for mailing.

Sec. 2. The Post adjutant shall cause notice of the annual election to be given at least two weeks prior thereto.

Article IX—Rules of Order

Section 1. All proceedings of this Post shall be conducted under and pursuant to Roberts' Rules of Order, except as herein otherwise provided.

Article X—Limitations of Liabilities

Section 1. The Post shall incur, or cause to be incurred, no liability nor obligation whatever which shall subject to liability any other Post, subdivision, members of The American Legion, or other individuals, corporations or organizations.

Article XI—Amendments

Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended at any regular Post meeting by a vote of two-thirds of the members of said Post attending such regular meeting: Provided that the proposed amendment shall have been submitted in writing and read at the next preceding regular meeting of said Post: and, Provided, Further, That written notice shall have been given to all members at least 30 days in advance of the date when such amendment is to be voted upon, notifying said members that at such meeting a proposal to amend the By-Laws is to be voted upon.
