Park Revitalization

The City of Fountain Inn is one of South Carolina's fastest-growing cities, we recognize our need to ensure our parks and public amenities can accommodate that growth. The City of Fountain Inn currently oversees and maintains nine (9) parks and trails (Swamp Rabbit) spread across town. Among these is a 6.61 tract of land known as Sanctified Hill Park, a central hub for the primarily Black neighborhood around it and the only park on the Laurens County side of the city.

While Sanctified Hill Park is often referred to as the "forgotten park" since there have been no significant improvements to the park in decades, it is beloved and central to the surrounding community. Last year, cell phone data showed an increase in foot traffic of approximately 1,200% last spring and summer.

Currently, Sanctified Hill Park features a swing set consisting of four (4) swings and a basketball court split into two (2) half courts. On May 22nd, 2020, the city hosted community input sessions where residents gave input on what they would like to see in the park, and the town has since developed a park improvement plan that is estimated to cost \$2.3 million.

In 2020, Laurens County established a vote (majority in favor) that would invest and revitalize parks through a capital project sales tax. Sanctified Hill was earmarked for \$53,000. Proactively, the city is in pursuit of more funding to capture the wants and needs of this community.

We hope that the current improvements planned will allow Sanctified Hill Park to remain a community gathering place and be an accessible, inviting, and enjoyable space for generations to come.

The City of Fountain Inn, founded in 1886, is dedicated to creating a forward-thinking environment where the citizens can enjoy quality public services and recreation amenities, in a small-town atmosphere.

2. Describe in detail how the pandemic has affected your organization.

Public parks serve an essential societal function as recreational spaces for diverse communities with well-documented physical and mental health benefits. However, in 2020 South Carolina instituted park shutdown orders due to fears that public parks could facilitate SARS-CoV-2 transmission. City parks were closed from March 28, 2020, to April 30, 2020; however, when reopened, we saw a significant increase in foot traffic at all parks located in Fountain Inn, especially neighborhood parks like Sanctified Hill Park.

To maintain public safety, the City of Fountain Inn's Parks and Recreation Department has increased expenses to respond to public health emergencies, such as increased cleaning, sanitization of playground equipment, and staff monitoring of parks.

As such, parks may be crucial for how people have handled the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, particularly the increasingly limited recreational opportunities, widespread financial uncertainty, and consequent heightened anxiety.

3. How will any funding awarded be utilized?

The City contracted with Studio Main LLC to provide the City with Phase I construction documents and Park Masterplan. Phase One will include formalized parking, gateway signage, relocated basketball courts, playground(s), and landscaping.

100% funding will go towards park renovations: a new playground, (2) concrete basketball courts, aluminum bleachers, picnic shelter, walking trail, additional parking.

	The City of Fountain Inn was established in 1886 and continues to serve the area's residents with excellence to make our community the best place to live, work, and play. The City of Fountain Inn has received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for ten consecutive years and is well suited to disburse grant funds appropriately.

	We currently have an open dialogue with members of Golden View Baptist Church. We engaged with the community at the 2021 Block Party. Many of the local park-goers are participants or have been participants within our Rec program.

6. What is your plan for continuing your program(s) in the future, including funding sources?

The layout of the park does not provide adequate space for recreational programming; however, it would be used for rentals and encourage play with the addition of an accessible playground. This venue would be added to our fee schedule to provide additional rental facilities to the city. This park "could" be the future site for a "Gus Macker" style basketball summer tournament.

The future budget for the park would include monthly landscape maintenance I.E., trees, shrubs, mulch (or as needed, the cost is undetermined at this point until a landscape map is provided), surveillance/camera lease, bathroom cleaning, playground inspections, etc. Roughly estimated annual cost = \$800-\$1200 out of playground maintenance.

CSLFRF provides that states and other governments may spend these funds to "respond to the pandemic and its negative economic impacts, including assistance to ... nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality." Laurens County will be awarding grants to non-profits or similar organizations from the CSLFRF to help address critical financial needs of those organizations. For profit-businesses and individuals are not eligible for these County grants.
